## GOOD TO KnOW: STAIE TESTING

We have testing coming up in april and may. Below are the dates our students have testing. While we will take the test seriously, we also work hard to not make it the central focus of these weeks of learning. On testing weeks, help your child be successful by the following testing tips:

1. Go to bed early and get at least 8 to 9 hours of sleep
2. Eat a big breakfast, including protein
3. Arrive to school on time
4. Try your best to avoid big conversations/stressful topics before school on these dates
5. Encourage your student to try their best, while also affirming that these tests are hard
6. Help your student find a great library book or two to read during these weeks, as reading to self is often the early finishers option

## What We're Learning

## Literacy Workshop,:

We are completing FIVE PARAGRAPH ESSAYS! I am excited for your people about this because for many 4th graders, this is the first five paragraph essay they have ever written. Students have a wide variety of topics (they chose their topic) and I am guiding them through using a graphic organizer to plan a highly organized essay that includes persuasive, specific details and strong word choice. Essays will be on display at next week's visitor's center opening. You will also have the chance to see a writing portfolio, including this piece, at student led conferences coming up on April 26th.

## Math:

Our 4th graders just finished up their most successful learning unit, which was multiplication strategies. The class average was over $80 \%$ and every student showed improvement in the unit. Hurray! Our 5ths are finishing up a unit that connects the relationship between fractions and decimals, and how to multiply and divide both. I will continue to review the year's standards with both grade levels.

Storyline: The snow days and late starts have impacted the flow of our story a bit, but we have continued to form community with story.
Researchers received a newspaper from a nearby town with all sorts of actual and made up (related to our story) articles from September 2000 in Dayville, Oregon. A music fest has since taken over two of the John Day Units. Some students have noticed, however no one has expressed any concern about the impact of the music fest on the monument quite yet. Time will tell what happens. We are now working on creating a visitor's center opening for next Friday. Join us after the drum performance to see our projects!
