What We're Learning

Math: We are finally starting our split math learning. All students are reviewing place value, the value of a digit based on its place in a number. Our 4ths are practicing writing expanded form of numbers and reviewing addition strategies. Our 5th are reviewing the standard multiplication algorithm (this was very frustrating for many people which is OKAY because the algorithm ignores place value so this is a good thing to be frustrated by this!), then moving onto learn about order of operations. I also asked all 5ths to work on at least 30 minutes of **Freckle Math** at home as part of their homework plans. Our class code log in is **soelle**, and usernames are first and last names.

Writing: Come to Back to School Night to see what we've been working on! :)

Reading: We started our first reader's workshop read aloud, Home of the Brave, as a part of the Lucy Caulkin's curriculum. The first big focus of reader's workshop is writing about reading. Wowie this can be challenging for students!
