# What We're Learning

**Math:** We launched math by doing problem solving about equality and also thinking about different strategies for a fun dice rolling game. Next week we are diving into a special math launch unit on Video Games that will secretly teach your child a ton of math while being very engaging. Students will split into 4th and 5th grade math learning teams starting next week.

**Writing:** Our first unit is "The Best Parts of Me." There are multiple components to this writing project and it will help us explore who we are and share that with our community. This week we focused on creating a short comic that shows/tells something about us as a person.

**Reading:** Students were VERY eager to start read to self time. After proving that they could sustain 30 minutes of silent read to self, they earned the ability to check out books from our classroom library. The 5ths also received their reading log, where they will record the books they read during class this year. I will show this document to families at Back to School Night.

**Science/Social Studies:** Students worked in teams to build a contraption using only paper and masking tape that would hold a dictionary. We will share and test our design next week.

**Social/class:** Our goal is to work together in groups of 2 or 3, while also taking care of supplies during lessons. We also set up our class meeting norms and launched morning meeting.
